WCCA Meeting Minutes April 19, 2017

A Board of Directors meeting was held prior to the meeting to review: a) a request from Ojibwa for a \$400 donation for their youth day, b) a summer 300/200/100 cash raffle, and c) a request from Shultz for a donation of \$275 for the Take Aim at Cancer, which brings cancer survivors/family into the shooting sports.

All motions were made, seconded and passed as listed and the board will make each as a recommendation to the Alliance members.

President Ron Gray called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm at the Ojibwa Bowhunters clubhouse. The meeting was sponsored by Ojibwa, who provided the refreshments. The meeting was attended by 18 individuals, comprised of club delegates and the Wisconsin Conservation Congress.

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

The minutes of the March meeting were accepted as published.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

The Treasurer's report was accepted as reported.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

- **Kids Fishing Clinic** –
 - Looking to have a good weekend for the clinics.
 - Cabela's donated 160 rods, which works out to 10 per park.
 - The WCSFO printed 20,000 new copies of the handbook.
- **Conservation Congress/Spring Hearings** –
 - Ron Gray
 - Attended the Milwaukee County hearing: two young women took positions. Attendance was good, women outnumbered men.
 - Al Shook
 - Chaired Waukesha County hearing: 151 people attended, elections took an hour and at the end, Larry Wehrheim and Mary Diedrich were elected. The meeting went well.
 - CDAC Waukesha – 50 people completed the survey online. People are confused about the CDAC's role – as to whether the information should be solely DNR, 50/50 or something else. The county accepted 2600 antlerless permits, one free southern farmland and the holiday hunt.
